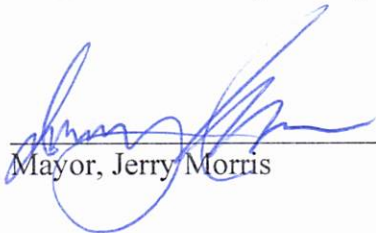
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WATER RATES OF THE CITY OF RICHLAND, TEXAS

WHEREAS, the City of Corsicana adopted an ordinance that would increase the water volume rates by .50 per 1,000 gallons effective October 1, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the City of Richland, Texas deems it necessary to pass this increase along to their customers.

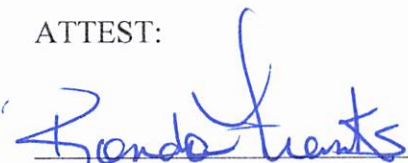
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHLAND, TEXAS, that effective October 1, 2025, the volume rates will be increased by .50 per 1,000 gallons, exact rates are on Exhibit A.

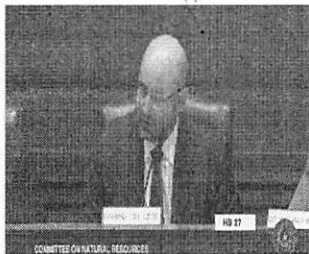
CEF'S 'A NIGHT IN PARIS' GALA SET FOR OCT 18

REP. HARRIS ISSUES REPORT ON PROGRESS ON GROUNDWATER PROTECTIONS



With a huge victory in our fight to protect East Texas groundwater, Governor Abbott added House Bill 27 to the call for the second special session. On Thursday we heard testimony on the legislation during a hearing of the Natural Resources Committee. This bill would put a moratorium on permits for the production and export of groundwater in the Neches and Trinity Valleys Groundwater Conservation District. During this period ending in 2027, the Texas Water Development Board would be required to conduct studies to analyze how much water is safe to remove as well as consider all the hydrological impacts of pumping from the aquifer.

The bill passed unanimously out of committee with an 11-0 vote. It will now move to the Calendars Committee.

The hearing began when I passed out printed versions of X posts

by Kyle Bass, the founder of Conservation Equity Management, who chose personal attacks and threats on social media as a way to oppose the constitutionally mandated work we are doing in the Texas House.
